Attainment of children and young people with EHC plans in the East Riding (2023)

This document should be read in conjunction with the Attainment Outcomes for Pupils with EHC Plans in East Riding schools (June 2023), also featured on this page.

Educational attainment outcomes for children with EHC plans in the East Riding, are higher in almost all indicators shown when compared to the regional and national averages. Some indicators show a lot of fluctuation in results over the past 7 years but have largely shown signs of improvement in the last year. This higher level of attainment for pupils with an EHCP is in contrast to those with SEN Support, who mostly record lower attainment rates when compared to region and national rates.

- The proportion of East Riding pupils with an EHCP achieving a good level of development at **Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)** in 2023, equated to 10.3%, higher than national (3.8%) and region (4.9%). The East Riding has achieved a higher percentage than both comparators since 2017. The East Riding observed a decline in attainment rates between 2018 and 2022 but saw a sharp increase (4.1%) between 2022 and 2023, which was a higher increase than either national or region (increases of 0.1% and 1.1% respectively). East Riding pupils with EHC plans achieving a good level of development (10.3%) was lower than the percentage achieved by East Riding pupils with SEN Support (23.4%) (page 3).
- East Riding pupils achieving the expected standard in **Phonics in Year I**, had been decreasing year on year since 2018, but in 2023 it increased again to 34.8%, higher than any other period over the past 5 years. The percent increase between 2022 and 2023 was 12.8%, higher than the increase achieved in the region and nationally (2.1% and 1.1% respectively). In all years since 2018, the percent of East Riding pupils with EHCP achieving the expected standard in phonics was higher than regional and national attainment (page 4).
- The expected standard at **KS1** 'Reading, Writing and Maths combined' was achieved by 9.8% of East Riding pupils with a EHCP, higher than region and national (6.1% and 6.6% respectively). The East Riding has recorded a sharp decline in attainment between since 2019 (when it was 19.1%), by 2023 this was a reduction of almost 10%. Between 2022 and 2023, the East Riding attaiment rate reduced by 2%, in contrast region and national increased (but only marginally at 0.3% and 0.2%) (page 5).
- For the **KS2 'Reading, Writing and Maths combined'** in 2023, 14% of East Riding pupils with an EHCP achieved the expected standard. This was again higher than region and national (both 8.3%). The East Riding recorded a decline in attainment between 2018 and 2022 (which was also partially observed at regional and national level) but there was an increase in the East Riding between 2022 and 2023 of 4.2%, a higher increase than region and national (page 9).
- There was a decrease in the East Riding attainment score of **Year 4 multiplication** check between 2022 and 2023 from 14.8% to 14.6%, in contrast the region and national averages increased (page 13).
- The **KS4 Average Attainment 8 Score** for East Riding pupils with an EHCP had risen and fallen between 2018 and 2020 before plateuing from 2021 onward. In 2023, the average attainment score of 20.2 was higher than region (13.7) and national (14). (page 14).
- Despite being a negative number, the East Riding 'Progress 8 Score' (-0.89) increased at a higher rate between 2022 and 2023 than both national and region (page 15).
- Level 2 Attainment at age 19 for East Riding pupils with an EHCP has recorded sharp increases and decreases between 2017 and 2023, but with a year on year increase since 2020. In 2023, the

East Riding Level 2 attainment at 51.3% was higher than the regional (25.4%) national (28.9%) levels (page 16). Level 3 attainment at 19 years was also higher in the East Riding (26.3%), with a year on year increase since 2020.
