Hull - Hull are working on food poverty issues

- Hull are working with MESMAC on the topic of CYP's sexual health.
- Hull are in the process of upskilling youth councillors and training them to become peer mentors for other CYP.
- Hull created an animated video with my pockets around school meals and food poverty.

North Lincolnshire

- Main problem within their area is school meals e.g. the quality, affordability and nutrition in them.

Local Actions

- Each locality to approach LEA's around school meals etc.
- Approach academies around school meals.

Question 1- Why was crime & safety second in the MYM poll?

- Violence against women and girls.
- Lack of access to public transport puts CYP at risk and makes them feel unnecessarily unsafe at times.
- The levels of ASB (Antisocial Behaviour) in communities.
- Drugs e.g. dealing,personal use etc.
- The levels of knife crime and how many CYP carry knives.
- The amount of crime portrayed on social media.
- Influencers on social media posting crime and influencing CYP to commit crimes at times.
- People having perceptions over facts, thinking there is more crime taking place than there actually is.

- The amount of racism and discrimination taking place within communities, online etc

50% of CYP present agreed that a lot of people may have voted that crime and safety was an issue in their community due to their perceptions of crime levels rather than the actual true levels of crime.

50% of CYP present agreed that a lot of people may have voted that crime and safety was an issue in their community due to the exaggeration of crime levels spoken and posted about on social media.

60 % of CYP present agreed that a lot of people may have voted that crime and safety was an issue in their community due to CYP vaping underage.
